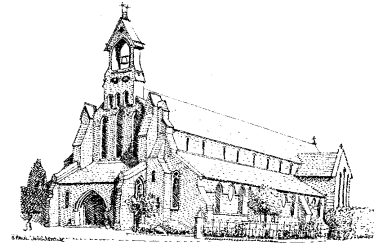

PARISH WALK

Saturday 1st November, 1.00pm, 3miles approx.

Sean Close writes:

We start our walk at Longlands Lake carpark. We make our way via the wooden bridge over Keekle Beck. The original bridge over the beck was the scene of a tragedy on Oct 20th 1703 when there was a triple drowning; Phoebe Robertson, Joseph Thompson and Robert Sharpe of Cleator lost their lives - they were crossing the bridge when the beck was in flood, the bridge collapsed and they were drowned. They were buried in the same grave two days later.

Going further back this area saw even more dramatic loss of life when in 1307 and 1315 Robert the Bruce invaded the parishes of St Bees, Cleator and Egremont. He razed the churches to the ground, rounded up two hundred women and children, put them into a barn and set it on fire with the loss of all lives. Cruel times - a referendum is certainly a better approach!

We cross the main Cleator/Egremont road and head towards Clints Quarry via Woodend. Note from the **map on the notice board**, the many pits on the way. Conditions permitting and for those who are able, we trek round Clints Quarry. A marvellous landscape filled, in season, with beautiful flora - including rare orchids and grasses, and fauna. The Quarry was closed in the 1930s and is now a nature reserve.

Our walk continues along the cycle path to Egremont and along East Road to the Fell road bridge. We follow the river Ehen to Longlands lake enjoying the views of Dent.

Longlands lake itself is interesting - it is formed by three pits collapsing and filling with water - making the great wild life place we know and love.

We are trying to raise money for a new keyboard so any sponsor money raised will be greatly appreciated. Sponsor forms available at the back of church.
